THE WORLD OF TEA

Except for water, "Tea" is the most popular beverage in the world. Tea originated in China more than 5,000 years ago. It was carried to the rest of Asia by Buddhist priests and subsequently European missionaries. It wasn't until the 17th century, however, when tea began being carried by Portuguese traders back to Lisbon, that Europeans began drinking tea.

The popularity of tea was growing throughout Europe among all social classes. But it was the Portuguese princess, Catharine of Braganza, who married Charles II of England and brought a chest of tea back with her to London that the tea craze took over. As she began serving it to her aristocratic friends, the word spread.



Types of Tea

All tea comes from one plant, the Camellia Sinesis. The way in which the leaves are processed gives us the **three major categories: green, black and oolong**. There are also white teas, pu-erhs and pouchongs. The regions and conditions in which the plants are grown, as well as how they are processed and handled all contribute to the enormous variety of teas in the marketplace today.

HOW DO YOU TAKE YOUR TEA?

Milk or Sugar?

If you prefer your tea with milk and with sugar, most full-bodied black teas, flavored or unflavored, can be enjoyed with milk and a sweetener. Darjeelings and lighter bodied black teas generally do not take well to milk, but certainly the sweetener of your choice can be used.

Green teas and white teas, because of their higher acidity, do not take milk. Sweeteners can be used. With tisanes (herbal beverages), it really does depend upon the individual tisane you are steeping whether or not they can handle milk. Most tisanes do well with a sweetener.

How to Store Your Teas

When purchasing teas, it is always best to purchase in smaller quantities. Tea is vulnerable to air, heat, light and moisture. It's generally best to store your tea in the container in which you purchased it. If you prefer to transfer it, pour your tea into a plastic bag, squeeze the air out and twist it closed. Then place your tea in an air-tight tin or ceramic canister and place in the cupboard. Your tea in the canister where it should keep very well.

How to Steep

The average serving uses 2 grams or one rounded teaspoon of loose leaf tea for every 8 ounces of water.

Water - Always use fresh cold water. The water temperature should be based on the type of tea you are preparing. For black tea, the water should be a **rolling boil**. For oolong tea, the water should have just **reached a boil**. And for green or white tea, the water should be just **below the boil**.

Tea - Always use quality, full leaf tea. Start with one teaspoon of tea for every 6 to 8 ounces of freshly-drawn water. Your taste will eventually determine how much to use. The more leaf, the stronger the flavor.

Time - Over-steeped tea will become bitter, so timing is important. Black and oolong teas steep for 3 to 5 minutes. Green and white teas from 1 to 3 minutes. When ready, decant into another pot, strain as you pour, or if you use an infuser, lift it from the cup or pot and enjoy.



Did you know **Earl Grey** is the most popular “flavoured black tea” in the world? How did this tea get its name? Legend says that ‘while Prime Minister Lord Grey traveled to China, he, or one of his servants, saved the life of a son of a Chinese mandarin from drowning. Lord Grey was given the tea as a way of saying “thank you”.

Tea and Your Health

Tea originated in China more than 5,000 years ago. Since that time, good health has been associated with tea. Today, scientific investigations have proven that health benefits do exist. Because tea, except for water, is the most consumed beverage in the world, the potential health benefits have important implications on health and disease prevention.

Recent studies reveal that fruits, vegetables and tea all contain the important antioxidants that contribute substantially to the promotion of health and prevention of chronic disease. From the beneficial flavonoids which neutralize the harmful effects of free radicals, to the increased metabolic rate in aiding diet and weight loss, tea is part of a healthy lifestyle, make it part of yours.

Cancer Fighter

The properties of both green and black tea have shown promise in the search to help prevent cancer. Polyphenols could play an active role in prevention of breast cancer to prostate cancer. These powerful antioxidant properties are being studied by research groups around the world.

Heart Health

For years research has suggested that drinking tea is associated with improved cardiovascular health. Studies presented at the American College of Cardiology showed that by drinking just 4 cups of black tea per day showed improved blood vessel function.

Bone Health

A study published in the American Journal of Clinical Nutrition found that older women who drank tea actually had higher bone mineral density measurements (BMD) than women who did not drink tea.

Oral Health

Research also shows by drinking one cup of tea a day the flavonoids may inhibit the plaque-forming ability of oral bacteria. Tea’s naturally occurring fluoride also supports healthy tooth enamel.

During a time when so many people are trying to improve their health, reassess priorities and take more time to relax and enjoy life, making tea a regular part of your daily routine seems so natural. Tea, full of health-promoting antioxidants and minerals, is a natural part of a healthy lifestyle.

GREEN TEAS - After plucking, the freshly picked leaves are left to wither on drying racks. The necessity and duration of withering varies widely according to the desired type of tea. The withered leaves are then heat treated by pan firing or steaming to stop or slow oxidation (fermentation). The leaves are then rolled to release the juices and enzymes and spread out on bamboo trays to dry. In many cases the leaf is rolled into an artistic or classic shape with the finest teas still hand-rolled.



Lung Ching Superior - Rare

The most renown of all China teas, also known as Dragon Well. This hand-made classic green has a delicate golden brew with a slightly sweet taste.

Lung Ching - Premium

From the West Lake area of Hangzhou, China. This is an excellent grade of Dragon Well. Tender bud sets allow for a clear, sweet brew. Wonderful.

Bi Luo Chun Special Grade - Rare

These hand-processed leaves are curled into the famous Green Snail Spring shape during pan firing - a slightly sweet, mild flavor with a pale brew.

Black Needle - Classic

The uniqueness of this tea is it looks 'black', but will change to green when steeped. Carefully made of very dark green, hand-plucked single buds.

Chunmee Special Grade - Classic

Spring-picked, hand-processed green tea that resembles a woman's finely formed brow. Slightly sweet, plum-like flavour ~ a wonderful brew.

Premium Mao Feng Green - Classic

This premium mao feng, or hairpoint, is made of very dark, green, almost hairlike leaves, gently twisted during its firing.

Morning Dew Green - Premium

From China, a wonderful green tea for your morning cup with a rich, slightly sweet flavor.

Premium Sencha - Premium

From Japan, elegant, flat, dark green leaves yielding a golden-green, aromatic brew with a fresh flavor.

Gen Mai Cha - Premium

Japanese Sencha green blended with roasted, puffed rice giving this tea it's traditional toasty flavor. An excellent tea.

Pinhead Gunpowder - Premium

This pearl tea is very tightly rolled. Very complex with a slightly sweet undertone. Watch the pellets gracefully unfurl.

Young Hyson - Premium

These thin young leaves are rolled and twisted during their pan firing - a slightly sweet, mild flavor. A wonderful tea for every day.

FLAVORED AND SCENTED GREEN TEAS

 - Green teas lend themselves very well to scenting or flavouring. Green tea and black tea may be further enhanced by the addition of scents or flavors from spices, herbs, flower petals or essential oils. Flower petals most often used can be jasmine petals, rose petals, gardenia, lavender or hibiscus. Fruits such as mango, quince, pineapple, currants and peaches are quite popular as are ginger, cardamom, citron and cinnamon. With jasmine scented teas, ordinary grades may be scented two or three times with special grades scented up to seven times.

Super Yin Hao Jasmine - Rare

Slender leaves with silver tips scented with jasmine petals and then removed - only the scent remaining. Superior quality.

Silver Jasmine Rosettes - Rare

Exquisite hand-tied silver buds, gently scented with jasmine. Enjoy the beauty of its presentation.

Jasmine Petals - Premium

Jasmine petals are layered between the green leaves leaving an aromatic scent and tiny bits of petals. Delicious.

Jasmine Dragon Pearls - Rare

These delicate pearls are infused with the soothing blossoms several times during the scenting process.

Afternoon Tea

Afternoon Tea was first introduced by Anna, the seventh Duchess of Bedford (1783-1857). During Victorian Times, a large breakfast was served late morning, and dinner was not served until 8 in the evening. Feeling a little peckish in the late afternoon, and not wanting to risk ridicule, Anna asked her servants to prepare a tray of tea with light sandwiches and biscuits and bring it to her boudoir. She soon began inviting lady friends in to share in this light repast.

Afternoon Tea soon became not only acceptable, but fashionable. This tradition filtered down to the working class who more often enjoyed "high tea" or "meat tea", which is a family meal served at a "high" counter in the kitchen and often included cold roasts, game, curried eggs as well as fruit tarts, custards and puddings.

Cost Per Serving

WHITE TEAS - Until a few decades ago, white tea was a well guarded secret of Chinese emperors and plucking was only performed by young women with gloved hands. Today, pure white teas are still produced on a very limited scale. The finest white teas being plucked before the spring rains, before dawn, when the new buds (unfurled leaves) are still closed. They are withered naturally and then dried.

With white tea being enjoyed more now than ever before, and with the demand on flavoured teas, we have created some wonderful, and affordable white tea blends - each light, delicate and unique. For a subtle taste, pale infusion, low caffeine and high antioxidant level, drink white tea.

Silver Needles - Exceptionally Rare

To produce oolong, the leaves are left to wilt naturally, but the moisture content is reduced until only the outer edges of the leaves have dried. The tea is then fired to stop this oxidation, rolled and dried. Purists say to brew oolongs properly, the gong fu method should be used. We say, just enjoy.

BLACK TEAS - Black tea is grown primarily in China, Taiwan, India, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, parts of Africa and South America. Whether machine picked or hand picked, the process for black teas begins by drying or withering the leaves to reduce their moisture content. They are then rolled and fired before being cut or curled. After processing, the leaf is graded according to size.
